Impacts to Daily Life	Impact level: "Act with Care" to protect yourself and others by wearing face coverings and maintaining physical distancing. High-risk populations and kupuna are encouraged to still stay at home to the extent possible.	Stay-at-home, work-from-home order is extended until September 24, 2020, with modifications to allow for limited outdoor activities. The wearing of non-medical grade face coverings is mandated at indoor public spaces, including private offices, indoor and open-air malls and public government buildings, businesses and organizations, and on public transportation. Such face coverings are also mandated outdoors in public spaces when physical distancing of six (6) feet from persons who are not members of the same household or residence is not feasible. Travel	A 14-day self-quarantine is required for all travelers from out-of-state and for interisland travelers arriving on the counties of Kauai, Hawaii, Maui and Kalawao on Molokai. Religious Services	Indoor gathering places, including places of worship , are allowed to open with social distancing and safety measures in place. Parks and Beaches	<p>Check the Department of Land & Natural Resources' list for the status of various state beaches & parks.</p>	<p>In addition to State of Hawaii proclamations for activities allowed, the following rules for outdoor activities are in effect:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • City parks, botanical gardens and state parks and trails are re-opened to allow only for lawful activity, including walking, running, biking, sitting, fishing, etc., but only by oneself. No group activities are allowed. • Beaches are open for lawful activity but only by oneself. No group activities are allowed. • Shooting & archery ranges may remain open. • Bicycle paths and designated community garden plots are open, but basketball and tennis courts, swimming pools, and playgrounds shall remain closed. • Lookout parking lots are open. • Outdoor organized team sports are suspended. 	<p>Most County parks are open with restrictions. Stay at Home Order	Through noon on September 11, 2020, individuals must stay at home, subject to limited exceptions such as obtaining food and household necessities, going to and from work at critical businesses, seeking medical care, caring for dependents or pets, or caring for a vulnerable person in another location.	Curfew in effect from 2 a.m. to 4 a.m. subject to modification by local mayors.	There are no stay-at-home orders in effect.
Travel	Travelers arriving from high-risk areas must complete a 14-day quarantine , either at a government facility or, if they have negative PCR test results less than five days before arrival, at a home or rental lodging. Travelers arriving from low-risk areas are not required to quarantine, but must be tested five days after arrival. Please see link above for information for travelers from other areas, and for returning residents. Guam residents are strongly discouraged from unnecessary off-island travel to any destination.	Anyone arriving from a country with an outbreak of COVID-19, including Guam, Hawaii & Mainland U.S. must undergo a 14-day quarantine . Arriving travelers going to Tinian or Rota must quarantine for 14 days on Saipan & be certified asymptomatic.	Mandatory 14-day quarantine for all travelers who have been in areas affected by COVID-19 or who have been exposed to COVID-19. Isolation for at least 14 days for any person proven or strongly suspected to be infected by COVID-19. Any person arriving at any port of entry must complete a health declaration form and submit to all and testing and quarantine procedures determined by the Minister of Health.
Business Operations	All businesses must close temporarily through September 11, 2020, except those designated as critical businesses under applicable DPHSS Guidance .	In addition to essential businesses & critical services, businesses that are open to the public can now be open from 5 a.m. to 1 a.m. The following businesses are allowed to operate subject to specific occupancy and social distancing guidelines and various restrictions . For example: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Restaurants may reopen for table service with a 25% occupancy limit and other restrictions. Non-contact recreational activities are permitted under strict social distancing guidelines. Businesses engaged in gaming, recreational & amusement activities remain closed.	Worksites, restaurants & businesses may resume regular operating hours with restrictions .
Parks/Beaches	All public parks and beaches are open for individual exercise.	Public parks remain closed. All public beaches and pathways are officially open for all recreational activities, including social gatherings, subject to the social distancing requirements stated in the CNMI COVID-19 Emergency Directives. No-contact recreation activities are permitted with restrictions.	Public parks, gyms & other recreational areas may resume regular operations.
